Intensive Reading Workshop

WASL retakes: 10th & 11th grade students (in the 2006-07 school year) will be eligible to retake the WASL test at Battle Ground High School this August. Students will need to preregister with the state June 8th to July 8th either online at <http://www.k12.wa.us/waslregistration> or by calling 1-866-400-WASL (9275). All students will need photo ID for entry the day of the tests. Tentative dates for retakes are as follows: Reading is Monday, August 6th, Math is Tuesday, August 7th, and Writing: Expository is Wednesday, August 8th. Additional information is forthcoming; however, please note these important August dates when planning your summer activities.

Important Information!

- Standards of conduct for all students enrolled in Community Education High School Credit classes are the same as described in the Battle Ground High School and Prairie High School Student Handbooks. These handbooks are available upon request from our office.
- Call Community Education, 885-6584, for a High School Credit Classes registration form (required). A class fee of \$175 must be **prepaid** to the Community Education office located at 104 West Main Street, Battle Ground; or mail to Community Education, PO Box 200, Battle Ground, WA, 98604-0200 before the class begins. **Students will not be allowed into class without prior payment. Refunds are not available after class starts.**
- Attendance is important due to the intensity and condensed time frame of the class. Failure to meet the required time in class due to absences and tardies will result in an automatic 'F' and forfeiture of the class fee.

High School Credit Class registration forms are also available in your school counseling office.
